There were not any issues identified covered by the scope of the guideline.

There may be differences between men and women in the way they present with symptoms for obstructive sleep apnoea/hypopnoea syndrome (OSAHS) and obesity hypoventilation syndrome (OHS).

People with some learning and developmental disabilities may have particular communication needs that may need consideration when completing questionnaires and when adapting to new treatments such as continuous positive airway pressure (CPAP). Taking these communication needs into account is expected to be part of standard care and so no separate recommendations have been made.

3.3 Have the Committee's considerations of equality issues been described in the guideline for consultation, and, if so, where?
Yes for some research recommendations we have included both clinical and physiological phenotypes, including gender.
3.4 Do the preliminary recommendations make it more difficult in practice for a specific group to access services compared with other groups? If so, what are the barriers to, or difficulties with, access for the specific group?
The access to services included in the recommendations does not discriminate against any particular group.

The draft recommendations are not considered to have an adverse impact on people with disabilities.
