1. Welcome, apologies, introductions and objectives

The Chair welcomed the Committee members and attendees to the 14th meeting on Social, emotional and mental wellbeing in primary and secondary education.

The Chair introduced Linda Grainger, who presented on NICE Pathways before seeking volunteers from the committee to work with her in updating the Pathway for this guideline.

8. Expert testimony discussion

Chris Carmona discussed with the committee the importance of inviting experts to provide testimony before seeking any further suggestions.

9. Review Questions 2.1, 2.2 & 2.3 – Continue drafting of recommendations in light of expert testimony

Giacomo De Guisa revisited with the committee, recommendations drafted the previous day in light of testimony provided by the expert witnesses.
