It was mentioned that the reference ranges that help with the interpretation of laboratory tests are often derived from populations that do not represent the ethnic diversity of patient cohorts or pregnant mothers and children where the assay is performed.

Not in the scope. The review questions will look at stratifying by these groups to take account of this.

'Disability' has been added to the section on equality considerations in the scope. This relates to mental health and fatigue and was already listed in section 1 of the EIA form.
