### 2 Introduction

## 2.1 NICE quality standards

NICE quality standards are a concise set of prioritised statements designed to drive measurable quality improvements within a particular area of health or care.

The standards are derived from high-quality guidance, such as that from NICE or <u>accredited</u> by NICE. They are developed independently by NICE, in collaboration with health, public health and social care practitioners, their partners and service users. Information on priority areas, people's experience of using services, safety issues, equality and cost impact are considered during the development process.

NICE quality standards are central to supporting the Government's vision for a health and social care system that is focused on delivering the best possible outcomes for people who use services, as detailed in the <u>Health and Social</u> Care Act (2012).

# 2.2 This topic overview

# 3 This quality standard

The development of the quality standard will begin in May 2014 and is expected to take 10 months to complete.

# 3.1 Population and topic to be covered

This quality standard will cover the identification, treatment and management of psychosis and schizophrenia (including related psychotic disorders such as schizoaffective disorder, schizophreniform disorder and delusional disorder) in adults (18 years and older) with onset before the age of 60 years in primary, secondary and community care.

# 4 Existing indicators

QOF MH001. <u>The contractor establishes and maintains a registers of patients with schizophrenia, bipolar affective disorder and others psychoses and other patients on lithium therapy.</u>

- QOF MH002. The percentage of patients with schizophrenia, bipolar
  affective disorder and other psychoses who have a comprehensive care
  plan documented in the record, in the preceding 12 months, agreed
  between individuals, their family and/or carers as appropriate.
- QOF MH003. The percentage of patients with schizophrenia, bipolar affective disorder and other psychoses who have a record of blood pressure in the preceding 15 months. NICE Menu: NM17
- QOF MH007. The percentage of patients with schizophrenia, bipolar affective disorder and other psychoses who have a record of alcohol consumption in the preceding 15 months. NICE Menu: NM15
- QOF MH008. The percentage of patients (aged from 25 to 64 in England and Northern Ireland, from 20 to 60 in Scotland and from 20 to 64 in Wales) with schizophrenia, bipolar affective disorder and other psychoses whose notes record that a cervical screening test has been performed in the preceding 5 years. NICE Menu: NM20
- QOF MH009. The percentage of patients on lithium therapy with a record of serum creatinine and TSH in the preceding 9 months. NICE Menu: NM21
- QOF MH010. The percentage of patients on lithium therapy with a record of lithium levels in the therapeutic range in the preceding 4 months. NICE Menu: NM22
- QOF SMOK002. The percentage of patients with any or any combination of the following conditions: CHD, PAD, stroke or TIA, hypertension, diabetes, COPD, CKD, asthma, schizophrenia, bipolar affective disorder or other psychoses whose notes record smoking status in the preceding 15 months.

- QOF SMOK005. The percentage of patients with any or any combination of the following conditions: CHD, PAD, stroke or TIA, hypertension, diabetes, COPD, CKD, asthma, schizophrenia, bipolar affective disorder or other psychoses who smoke whose notes contain a record of an offer of support and treatment within the preceding 15 months. NICE Menu: NM39
- NICE Menu: NM18. <u>The percentage of patients aged 40 and over with schizophrenia, bipolar affective disorder and other psychoses who have a record of total cholesterol: hdl ratio in the preceding 15 months.</u>

- NICE Menu: NM20. <u>The percentage of patients with schizophrenia, bipolar affective disorder and other psychoses who have a record of BMI in the preceding 15 months.</u>
- NICE Menu: NM42. <u>The percentage of patients aged 40 and over with schizophrenia</u>, bipolar affective disorder and other psychoses who have a record of blood glucose level in the preceding 15 months.
